The development of a community-focused One Health system requires mobilization of public and private resources for early detection, mitigation, and control of existing outbreaks, as well as prevention measures to reduce future outbreaks.

ADDRESSING FINANCIAL BARRIERS



Access to micro-finance, cost-shared grants, and income-generating activities and other supports will help poor women and indigenous livestock keepers adopt One Health approaches.

REACH



The Gender Responsive One Health Project is expected to reach more than 86,000 people in Kenya and Ethiopia, including:

- 70,000 women farmers and their households
- 15,000 environment resources users, other farmers, market vendors, processors, and consumers
- 1,200 community health workers, veterinarians, para-professionals, game wardens, and decision-makers
